

Dick North is a writer and historian. He is the author of numerous books depicting Yukon history. In the 1965, North discovered the hideaway cabin of writer Jack London and had it dismantled and moved to Dawson City, Yukon, where it was established as the Jack London Interpretive Centre and Museum. In 2007, North became a member of the Order of Canada “for his ongoing commitment to the preservation and promotion of the history of the Yukon territory.” He lives in Dawson City.
